GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES

Isaiah 9

DOES GOD KEEP HIS PROMISES?

YES, GOD ALWAYS KEEPS HIS PROMISES BECAUSE HE IS FAITHFUL.

After Adam and Eve rebelled, God promised a Rescuer would come from Eve's family. God's people waited for Him to keep His promise. God spoke to His people through prophets.

Isaiah shared a message about God's promise to send a Rescuer. This is what Isaiah wrote:

"The people are living in darkness now, but they will see a great light. This is how God will keep His promise: A child will be born for us, a son will be given to us, and the government will be on His shoulders. He will be named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace."

These names tell us who Jesus is and the great things He would do. Jesus would be a king who cares about His people, and He would bring peace to the whole world.

Isaiah also said, "His kingdom will be full of His power and peace. He will be a good, fair, and loving King who reigns forever."

Christ Connection: God keeps His promises. He remembered His promise to send a Rescuer and sent His Son, Jesus, into the world as a baby. Jesus grew up and provided salvation for sinners by dying on the cross and rising from the dead.


